#### Section 4 - First Aid Measures

### **Inhalation**

If inhaled, remove affected person from contaminated area and keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing. Keep at rest until recovered. If symptoms develop and/or persist seek medical attention.

#### **Emergency Procedures**

# Section 7 - Handling and Storage

# Handling and storage

This material is a Scheduled Poison S5 and must be stored, maintained and used in accordance with the relevant regulations.

#### **Precautions for Safe Handling**

Avoid inhalation of vapours and mists, and skin or eye contact. Wear PPE as described in section 8. Use only in a well ventilated area. Keep containers sealed when not in use. Prevent the build up of mists or vapours in the work atmosphere. Maintain high standards of personal hygiene i.e. Washing hands prior to eating, drinking, smoking or using toilet facilities.

# Conditions for safe storage, including any incompatibilities

Store in a cool, dry, well-ventilated area, out of direct sunlight. Protect from freezing. Store in suitable, labelled containers. Keep containers tightly closed. Store away from incompatible materials listed in section 10. Ensure that storage conditions comply with applicable local and national regulations.

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# **Section 8 - Exposure Controls and Personal Protection**

#### Occupational exposure limit values
